## Spotlight On: Bread for the World

In the fall of 2006, the United Campus Christian Foundation started a campus chapter of Bread for the World ([www.bread.org](http://www.bread.org)), "a nationwide Christian movement of people that seek justice for the world's hungry people by lobbying their nation's decision makers." Six students formed the core leadership of this group, and we met weekly to read and discuss Bread for the World founder, Rev. Arthur Simon's book, *How Much is Enough?* In addition, we wrote letters to congress about hunger related issues, (and set up a table on campus to get other students to write letters as well), became educated about the "One" campaign (to fight global AIDS and poverty), and volunteered sorting food at the Midwest Food Bank in Bloomington. Plans for the 2007-2008 semester include getting more students involved with "Bread" as we continue to write letters, get involved, and work on hunger and justice issues in our local community.
